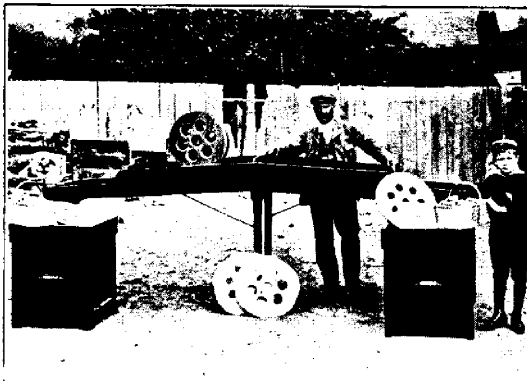


FIG. 1350.—FRUIT GRADER.
