

Christi.

The Minister of Instruction of Chile has granted subsidies to a number of public institutions. The Salesian Church and school of St. Vincent de Paul, Valparaiso, get \$6,000 and \$2,-400 respectively, while the school of the Our Saviour Asylum receives \$600, and the Foundling Asylum \$1,-500. In Santiago the normal school of the parish of St. Michael gets \$1,-200 while the school of the Franciscans receives \$1,500. In Copiapo the College of Physicians gets \$2,400 and the young ladies' school of the Immaculate Conception receives \$4,800. In Talea the parochial school receives \$1,200 and the College of Physicians \$1,500.
