

The demonstration of the *Bacillus Tuberculosis* in sputum is one of the commonest and at the same time one of the simplest of all bacteriological examinations required, and called for, but while a common and simple matter, it must be carried out in all details with the same care and technique as is necessary to a successful outcome in a much more difficult and complicated procedure, and this demonstration of bacillis tuberculosis will serve for a type for all smear or film preparations, which urges us to give in all detail.
