the history of the human race itself. All through the Old Testament we observe instances of marriage commanded by God, sanctioned and blessed by Him. And among the Jews, who held the true divine tradition, we find the single state regarded as disgraceful, and sterility in the marriage life not only looked upon as a re-proach, but also considered as a mark of the displeasure of God. Parents were always held in honor, and considered themselves blessed according to the number of their children. "Blessed is the man," says the Psalmist, "who hath his desire filled with them; he shall not be confounded when he shall speak to his enemies in the gate." The blessings of a numerous and healthy offspring depend upon the sacred character and inviolability of marriage. So we see that where marriage is lightly esteemed, among those who practice the infamous and unnatural system of divorce, children are regarded as disagreeable impediments to their disunion; and where a large family is not thought to be an honor or blessing from God, there you will find marriage degraded to a civil contract at will, and its most solemn obligations violated in the grossest manner.
