

18. The Executive Council shall [provide any report it may make] [report] on its consideration of the matter to States Parties. [If a breach of the Convention remains unrectified, the Executive Council shall refer the matter to the [Consultative Committee] [General Conference], which should decide on sanctions including the withdrawal of rights and privileges]. 1/ 2/ [The [Executive Council or the] [Consultative Committee] [General Conference] shall, where appropriate, bring the matter to the attention of the Security Council of the United Nations].

(The process after the submission of the report)

14. The requesting State shall promptly notify the members of the Executive Council through the Director-General of the Technical Secretariat of the results of the assessment of the request and the views of the requesting State and of other States. The Director-General of the Technical Secretariat shall provide to States Parties a copy of the report and the views of the requesting State and of other States. The Executive Council shall, as it deems necessary, consider the recommendations and decide on the steps to be taken. - 1/ The question of possible sanctions including the withdrawal of rights and privileges needs further careful examination in the context not only of challenge inspections but also of routine inspections and other elements of the Convention.
- 2/ A view was expressed that the possibility of the withdrawal of rights and privileges of the requesting State Party which has abused or misused the request needs also to be considered.
