Mr. Ralph E. Goodale (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Transport): The Canadian Transport Commission reports as follows: 1. Assuming the reference to be to the President of the Canadian Transport Commission (there is no office of Chairman of the C.T.C.), the present President was appointed September 1, 1972, and since the appointment has been paid at the rate of DM-3 (presently \$54,000 to \$66,000).
