Dear Sir,

According to the Italian laws, all the students who have obtained abroad degrees recognized sufficient by the Royal Italian Government may be inscribed without any further formality in any Italian university or high school of the Kingdom.

Besides, holders of foreign degrees may be admitted to the analogous examinations and be exempted, totally or partially from the yearly examinations, obtaining a declaration stating that the foreign degree has the same value as that issued by the Royal Italian universities or high schools.

The Royal Italian Government is now desirous to collect exact information about all universities of the world in order to establish their character in comparison with the Italian.

I beg therefore of your courtesy to supply me with all available information regarding the character of your University, the teachings there imparted and the relation with the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge in England.

I would also appreciate to have, if possible, a copy of the programs of the teachings, of the statutes constituting the University and of all regulations governing the studies.
