

was the author of the offensive pamphlet, and that Brissot and Pelleport were intimate, resolved to obtain the reward, and gratify his resentment. He applied to Pelleport, offering him the superintendence of a publication to be carried on at Bruges (near Ostend), the salary of which was to be two hundred pounds per annum. Pelleport accepted the offer. But it was necessary to stop at Boulogne, where some final arrangements were to be made. In the month of July Pelleport embarked for Boulogne with Captain Meredith. But the moment he landed, he was seized by the officers of the Police, who put him in chains and carried him to Paris, where he was sent to the Bastille. Du M—— was an agent of the Police of Paris. Information being given to the Police, that Brissot was at Boulogne, and that he was the intimate friend of Pelleport, he was immediately taken into custody, carried to Paris, and committed to the Bastille. However, it is certain that Brissot never wrote any thing against  
either
