ADDRESS.

“The project of creating manufacturing power in this Town has long engaged my attention. I have intended for some time past to draw up a brief exposition of my views on this subject, and lay it before my fellow-townsmen, when it was most likely to be favorably considered. A fit opportunity of submitting it to their notice appears to me to have now arrived; but I have had only time to throw together a few thoughts in an imperfect and hasty manner.
