

THE LATEST POSTAL LAWS

The Letter Rate for Canada, Newfoundland and the United States is 3 cents per oz., and for all other destinations 5 cents per oz.

Insufficiently prepaid letters posted in and out of the country will be returned with double the amount of the postage due thereon.

When posted wholly unpaid, they will be returned to the sender.

Insufficiently paid letters for or from the United States, Canada, Newfoundland, or any other foreign country, with the deficient postage on delivery, will be returned to the sender at least one full rate, &c.

Wholly unpaid letters for or from the United States, Canada, Newfoundland, or any other foreign country, will be returned to the sender with the deficiency.

Letters addressed to "Post Office" or "Post Office Box" only, unless a Street name is added, will be returned to the sender.

Letters must be properly addressed and must be paid for before or not, before being posted.

Parcels must be properly addressed and must be paid for before or not, before being posted. One letter may be sent with a parcel, but no other letters may be affixed to the parcel.

The following are the rates for letters by mail to and from the United States, Canada, Newfoundland, and the West Indies.

Domestic rates.

If not prepaid, 3 cents per oz.

Over 1 oz. to 2 oz., 5 cents.
