Claims for compensation for injury or sickness.

2. District Officers Commanding will be careful not to forward claims for compensation for sickness of, or injury to, men or horses, to Head-Quarters without the necessary certificates, etc., required by regulations and orders.

District Officers Commanding will submit claims in duplicate, and on each duplicate the medical officer or veterinary surgeon in charge should certify the exact number of days the man or horse was incapacitated from work.
