A SERMON before the Society

Our Lord alfo has * foretold that his Gofpel fhould be preached among all nations, which event took place, in part, previous to the first establishment of Christianity; but the prophecy remains to be completely fulfilled, when the converted Jew shall, by confirming the evidence, and by illustrating the doctrines of the Gospel, filence all objections, and bear down all oppofition to its truth.

In the predictions both of Daniel and of our Lord, dreadful calamities are the prelude to those diftinguished bleffings which they announce; and, what is remarkable, certain awful circumstances of the last Judgment are by each interwoven with their respective prophecies. To this grand confummation, the whole æconomy of Providence (we may prefume) refers, and as temporal fufferings become nothing when they are preparatory to eternal blifs, our Maker will inflict them in his mercy on a people, whom gentler admonitions do not reform. Our wildom, therefore, if we would avoid thefe fufferings, must consist in observing the figns of the times, and in accommodating our conduct to the will of God.
