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BEAUTIES OF DAHLIAS

J. McP. Ross Describes Them Before Horticultural Society.

St. George's Hall was well filled last night for the February meeting of the Horticultural Society. In a lecture by J. McP. Ross on dahlias, he said: "These plants will grow as easily as potatoes, if given rich, well worked soil. They are most desirable also because of their wealth of blossom, bright colors and late flowering season. Care must be taken not to plant them too early lest the tender shoots be nipped by the spring frosts. The endeavor was formerly to get the blossom as closely set and formal as possible. But now many growers are breaking away from this ideal and are producing flowers with

long curled petals, loosely set, such as the cactus dahlias. The
