Food Not Fit for a Dog.

A private in Company A, Eighth New York Volunteers, writes from Chickamauga Park on May 28, as follows:

Dear Mother—I write you these few lines to let you know how I got here, after riding a long time without anything to eat of any account. I must say it is miserable down here; the heat is terrible and there is no water. We sleep on the bare ground, and the food is awfully bad, nothing but hard tack and some salt pork that isn't fit for a dog to eat. Everybody is down-hearted and sorry he came. We expect to go to Porto Rico, but I don't know if we shall all get sick, and heaven knows what will become of us.

We got no money yet, and we don't know when we will get it. If you can send me anything in the form of sugar or condensed milk, send it, or some money, as the grub I get here I can't eat. I hope the war will soon be over, and they don't give us enough to feed a dog. Your affectionate son, Eddie.

Marines Driven to Bay.

The following is from a man in the First Battalion of the Marine Corps, who has been thirty-three years in the service, and fought all through the rebellion. It is dated at Key West:

Dear Brother—We are in camp, facing the ocean. The temperature is about 90, but being in this hot sun, you would think it was 500. The nights are cooler, but the mosquitoes and sand flies would eat you up, you would think. The men at this camp are starving. If you would look at our grub, you would see that we are all diseased, and I expect to see trouble, as old "Grey Whiskers" is drilling the life out of us in the bolting sun. We have men sick in camp here with complicated diseases, and they are all dying. We are sending them North on the account. What do you think we have to drink? Baked hot water! You would play us if you could only come down here and see us in camp.

We are under martial law here on the island, on account of the Cubans or negroes shooting a blue jacket. They went up to the jail and strung up the negro. The blue jackets got the praise for doing this in the New York papers, but it is untrue, as it was the marines who shot and got the credit for it.

I wish to ask you if you can oblige me by sending two dollars when you write, as I have no paper or stamps, having given them all away to men to write home.

No Money, and Food No Better.

Here is an extract from a letter from the brother of the last just quoted, who is also in the Eighth New York. It is dated June 4: "Dear Mother—The food here is no better and they keep on drilling us in the bolting sun five hours a day, and it's terrible. Joe looks terrible, and if his father don't get him out of here he will die. They gave us no money yet. Your affectionate son, Simon.

Editor of The New York Journal: I have a brother in one of our New York regiments, and he writes me that the men are being used very shamefully down South. He tells me the men are actually starving, and if they were not for the little help they receive from home they would not know what to do. The reason I write these few lines to your enterprising paper is to let you know the actual facts without any exaggeration.

Hard Tack and Water.

This is from two privates in the Seventy-First New York to a friend in this city. It is dated Tampa Heights, June 4: "Dear Friend John—We are now camped at the above-named place, and, as far as we have seen it, we like it much better than the old camp, as it is much cooler, although our food has taken an awful drop. For the last three days we have had nothing but hard tack and coffee, and our cook tells us that there is no more coffee in camp at present, so I expect our next meal will be hard tack and water. I think it is a shame the way we are being treated, as the regulars camped all around us are receiving the best of food, and I can honestly tell you it has knocked all the patriotic feeling out of this regiment, and if I ever get out of this hell hole I will help fight any of our battles again. I think you know me long enough to know that I am a druggist."
