FOUGHT LIKE A BULL. Halifax Officers Had a Right Tussle With an Alleged Post-office Robber.

Halifax, Aug. 2.—A week ago by Postmaster Hall, was burned down. At 10 o'clock, when the mail came in, Mr. Hall was at the postoffice. At 2, the place was a shambles. Investigation showed that the place had previously been entered and rifled. The safe bore the marks of heavy blows from an iron bar, which was found close by. In a nearby well the rifled mail bags were discovered. Captain Easton, an Alex. Fraser, alias Faulkner of Silver John, who had been seen hanging around Sheet Harbor. Two Halifax officers started out on Wednesday for Sheet Harbor, where they picked up Postmaster Hall, and proceeded to the postoffice. They drove 25 miles to Middle Musquodreville, where they got fresh horses and started for Sheet Harbor. At 10 o'clock Thursday the party came to a farm house on an unfrequented road, 40 miles from Sheet Harbor. Captain Easton, who was driving the gate. They went in and found a man. Fraser, who is a giant, not having time to load a revolver, which he carried, fought like a bull. The police, however, got into the rig, and started off, when Fraser made a sudden break, taking one officer with him out of the rig and disappeared over a fence. The two policemen retraced their journey, to head the fugitive off, and 14 miles away they found him in a lumber camp. He concluded the game by the highway, and successfully with his captors. They took him 22 miles to New Glasgow, and thence to Halifax, where his journey having extended over 200 miles. On Fraser was found a lot of stuff, including the supposed contents of a former fellow miner of Fraser's, who was robbed.

Chicago Gossip. Henry A. King & Co., 12 King Street East, received the following despatch to-day: Wheat—The volume of trade in wheat continues very light, and the speculative selling seems to be quiet. The large traders who usually take the long side are either away on vacations or waiting for the result of the harvest in the Northwest before renewing their interest in the market. There is a feeling at the close yesterday, which was apparent this morning, until some of the smaller shippers had covered. It became appreciatively dull and inactive. The stocks of the wheat are rapidly increasing, and the reports from European countries have materially lowered in the last 20 days. Crop conditions—Russia has a poor outlook. The weekly shipments from Russia, India, the Danubian Provinces and South America are all showing a decided falling off, which is in a measure due to the decline in price. Undoubtedly the result from the threshing season is better than in previous years, where harvesting is progressing or has not begun, have materially declined from former light prospects. It seems to us that the statistical situation all around is bullish, and favors bullheads, who are waiting for the best features are the amount on passage and the large crop which they are now harvesting in France, together with the general bearish feeling among the present crop speculators.

Crop Reports. A Chicago despatch says: Snow's crop report to be made public in a day or two, will show a drop of 6 points in corn, indicating a yield of about 100,000,000 bushels. Prime, on crops, says: The corn crop in nearly every State in the corn belt is reduced in yield. The season has been a crop year. The crops at the start had a poor send-off, and after being planted and to contend with more or less plant and adverse surroundings. It did not begin to grow until July, and then the drought struck the crops at the most critical stage. Fortunately, the rains of the last two days have for a time put a stop to the present precipitation, but at least 50, if not 60, days are needed to bring the crops to a normal yield. WHEAT AT A FRACTION LOWER. And Corn Off a Cent on the Chicago Board.

Speculative Market Very Dull—Operating Factors of the Situation—Visible Supply—World's Shipments—Ontario Wheat and Pennsylvania Notes and Gossip.

Tuesday Evening, Aug. 2. The speculative wheat market in Chicago to-day exhibited market activity, but despite the depressing effect of the absence of many buyers, wheat for all deliveries ran up 1/8¢ to 1/4¢ per bushel. The August article closed at 80 1/4¢, the top of the day, and the September at 79 1/4¢. The October at 78 1/4¢, the November at 77 1/4¢, and the December at 76 1/4¢.

The settlement of the Liverpool Board was a little lower than Friday's, with wheat at 1/2¢ per cent lower than Friday's last quotations, while future deliveries were 1/4¢ higher. Paris was lower 1/4¢ per cent yesterday.

At North and West Ontario points new wheat is offering at 95¢ to 1.00, while old cars are taken by millers at 75¢ to 80¢. Farmers say they are unable to pay over 80¢ for export. Old cars are being taken by millers at about 60¢. No wheat points on the Grand Trunk. No wheat offered at the Michigan Central. Central is accepted. There is little demand for old red winter, which is quoted at 60¢ to 65¢. No. 1 Manitoba has nominally 60¢ at Fort William.
