Production of Bullion for the Year 1898 Amounted to Over \$15,000,000. The Evening Telegraph of Colorado Springs, Colorado, has issued a very handsome mining supplement and in it gives very full details and statistics concerning the gold production of the Camp of Cripple Creek. Cripple Creek produced for the first time in 1891 and if is eredited with a production for that year of \$200,000. From that on there has been a wonderful increase, in 1897 the official production was given at \$12,500,000 and for 1898 it is \$15,602,000, making a total production from 1891 to 1598, inclusive, of \$53,502,000, which is indeed a great showing for a camp whose area is only four miles wide and six miles long.

The cash value of the dividends paid last year shows a nuch more remarkable increase than the production. The total dividends for 1897 are in the neighborhood of \$1.159,000, whereas for 1898 they amount to \$2.5921850. Besides this, it is estimated that there is fully \$5,000,000 cash held in reserve by the various mining companies of the district. Of these the Portland and the Gold Coln are credited with nearly \$1.000,000 aphece. The tonnage of one produced amounts to 401,590 tons, the average value being a little under \$39 to the ton, or about two ounces of gold to every 2000 lbs.

In reviewing some of the individual mines and mining companies some very interesting figures are given. For instance, the Portland, whose capitalization is 3,000,000 shares of the par value of \$1, the exact amount paid out in dividends to date is \$1,837,080. The Portland Company has paid \$2 dividends during the year. Three Ic dividends were paid in January, February and March; in April, May, June and July the dividend was increased to 1½c and on Auz. 5 the dividend was again increased to 2c, making a total for the year of \$570,000, against \$380,000 for 1807.
