

INLAND REVENUE DROPS RESULT OF PROHIBITION

OTTAWA, May 4—Prohibition is beginning to have a serious effect upon the inland revenue of the Dominion. During the month of March the gross revenue amounted to \$2,020,749, which is a decrease of a quarter of a million dollars as compared with March one year ago. The principal decrease is, of course, in sprits and malt liquor, the revenue from which is now less than the revenue from tobacco. Last month the excise revenue from spirits The war tax amounted to \$136,056.
