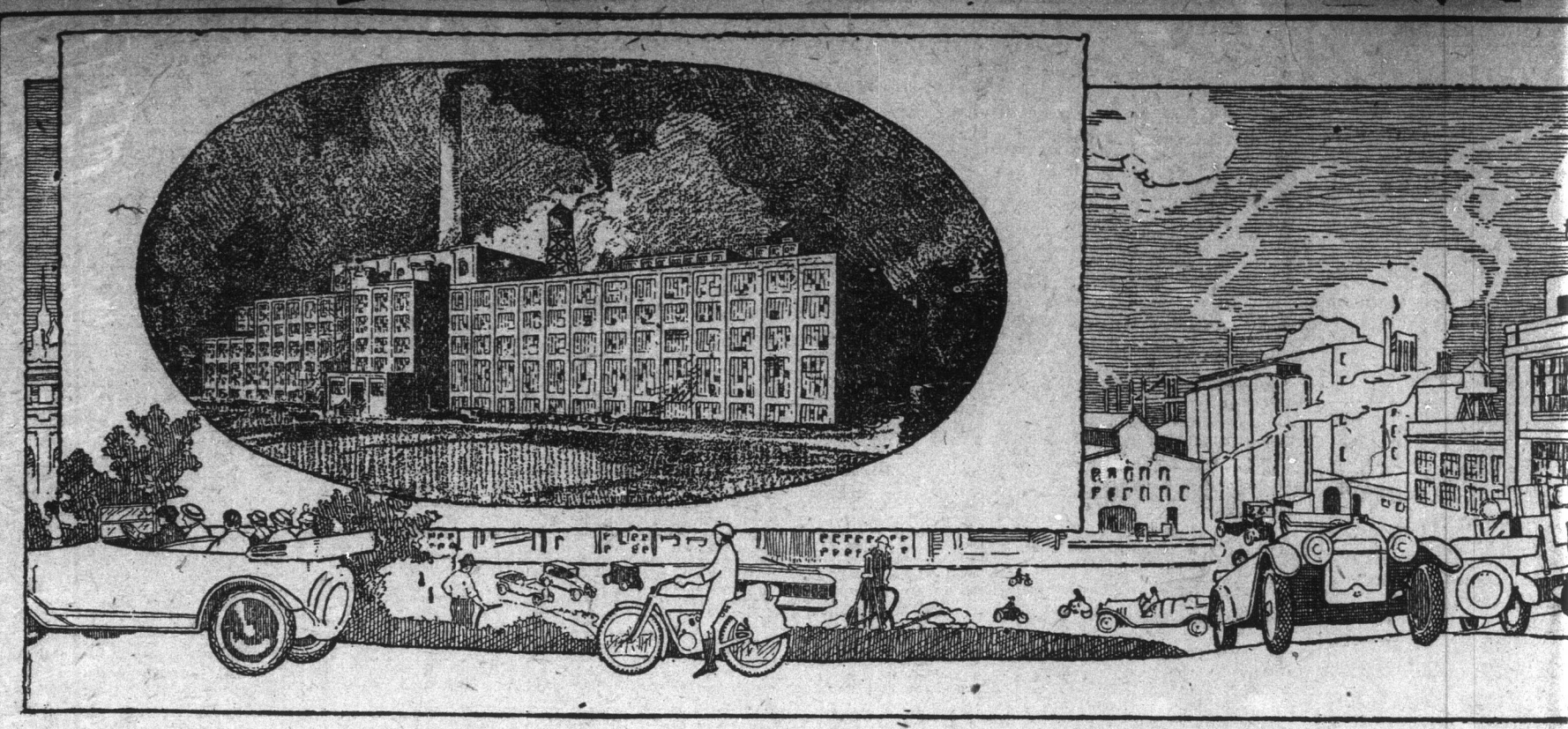

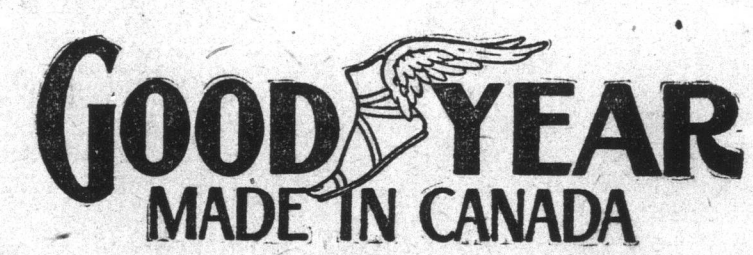

OTTAWA, Sept. 30.—Sir Robert Borden will be in his office Monday and daily cabinet meetings will be held until an accumulation of business is cleared away.

Again talk of cabinet reorganization is rife, and the word is that a half dozen changes may be looked for.

There is to be an assistant clerk of the crown-in-chancery named to count the overseas soldier's votes.

Finally there is to be the call for the first class of conscripts and the date of election. The cabinet has a fortnight's work in sight.

Blockade of Enemy Further Tightened

LONDON, Sept. 30.—A still more vigorous blockade of Germany is to be enforced by the Entente Allies as a result of the conference of Lord Robert Cecil, British minister of blockade, with the French minister of blockade.

Today the King signed a proclamation prohibiting the exportation of certain articles to Sweden and Holland.

The King's approval also was given to other measures to make it more difficult for the enemy to obtain supplies through neutral countries.
