

NEW POLITICAL PARTY IN U. S. **NOW ORGANIZED**

Avowed Purpose Is To Unite To Support Principles of Democracy.

KNOWN AS LABOR PARTY

Who Subscribe to Principles Eligible.

CHICAGO, Nov. 24.—A new national political body, to be known as the Labor Party of the United States, was created today by the representatives of organized labor in convention here. The object of the movement, as set forth in its constitution, will be "to organize all hand and brain workers of the country to support the principles of a political, social and industrial democracy."

The striking points in the party declarations are:

A national convention will be held next summer for the purpose of nominating candidates for president and Inating candidates for president and vice-president.

The affairs of the organization will be administered by a national committee, which will elect a secretary-treasurer as its executive head.

All Are Welcome.

Trades unions, farmers' organizations, co-operative bodies and all other associations which subscribe to the principles of the party are invited to become affiliated with it.

I shall now always think of the people of this country as my friends and I shall look forward keenly to an opportunity of repeating my visit."

In his parting message to the prince Mr. Lansing expressed the hope that he would carry away memories as agreeable as those he left behind.
"Permit me to express on behalf of this Government," the secretary said, "the satisfaction and pleasure which it has been to entertain as its guest so distinguished a representative of the British Empire, whose brief so-journ in this country has done so much to strengthen the friendship and goodwill of the two great English-speaking nations."

U.S. Railroaders Secure Agreement for Higher Wages

WASHINGTON, Nov. 24.—A new wage and working agreement was signed late today between the railway administration and officials of the Brotherhood of Maintenance of Way Employees and Railway Track Laborers. While demands of the union were not fully met, the eight-hour basic day was established for track laborers and others of that classification, and time and a half pay after that hour was provided. Most of the other employees included under the agreement will receive time and a half overtime pay after ten hours. overtime pay after ten hours.

Signing of the new contract by Director-General Hines ended negotiations which have been in progress since February. Approximately 400,000 mer are affected.

LIFTING OF EMBARGO IS LIKELY TO FORCE **UP PRICE OF WHEAT**

Canadian Farmers Will Then Have Market Across the Boundary Line.

[Special to The Advertiser.] OTTAWA, Nov. 24 .- The announce ment that the United States will lift the embargo against the importation of Canadian wheat on December 15 has All Hand or Brain Workers created deep interest at the capital, and the general impression is that the action of the Washington authorities will work to the advantage not only of the Canadian farmer, but of

Cost Increase.

Canadian farmer will secure the spread which now exists between the Canadian initial price and the price in the United States market. In the second place, the wheat will be sold for cash and not for credit as at present, and in the third place, the exchange situation may be adjusted and established.

The United States guaranteed a price of \$2.25 per bushel for the 1919 crop. But United States millers have been paying as high as \$2.80 for certain grades of hard wheat for mixing purposes. Canadian farmers near the boundary have been teaming their wheat across the boundary and realizing a difference of from 20 to 60 cents per bushel over the initial fixed Canadian price. Against the importation in wagon loads the United States has all offered no particular objection, but has placed an embargo against shipping by train or vessel, in spite of the fact that there is reciprocity in wheat and its products between the two countries. The embargo is to be lifted on December 15.

It is fully anticipated that the action of the United States will force the price of wheat in Canada up above not only the Canadian initial price, but also of cash versus credit, and with United States than to Great Britain on a basis of cash versus credit, and with United States urrency at a premium instead of at a discount.






