Sir Martin and Edward Go to England.
NEW YORK, Dec. 11.—The most important sale of race horses in many years was effected yesterday. Sir Martin, the champion 2-year-old of 1908, and his stable-mate, Edward, were sold by J. P. Madden to Louis Winans of Brighton, England. The terms of the sale were private, but it is understood that the price for the two horses was \$65,000. Sir Martin retired with a good record. He operated for \$700 to date and has several historic stakes to his credit. He finished behind Marketeer in the Futurity, but came out a week later and lost in the Flatbush. Edward is not as clever as Sir Martin, but is a better runner, a colt as some consider him. His winnings were about \$30,000. His principal victories were the Futurity and United States Hotel Stakes at Saratoga.

The new company takes over the business immediately after Dec. 31, and starts with bright prospects for a greater and more aggressive business than ever, and with a proud record of past achievement as a splendid incentive.
