### TRIED TO SAVE BROTHERS THEN SWAM TO ISLAND

Frank Hamilton Overcome as He Reaches Shore—The Wawa Tragedy.

Additional particulars of the drowning of John and Jas. Hamilton, sons of Rev. R. M. Hamilton of Weston, in the Lake of Bays, Muskoka, which The World exclusively announced yesterday, reached Toronto on Monday. John, aged 11, James, 13, and Frank, 15, left the Hamilton cottage, at Norway Point, about 1:30 in the afternoon, to visit their Sunday school teacher across the lake. A stiff wind was blowing, and when part of the way to their destination the boys' canoe capsized. The three found themselves in the water, away, possibly, from the canoe. Jack and Jim, it is said, were not good swimmers, and they may have clasped each other, either from self-preservation or in the hope of saving each other.

The upset occurred near Blarvin Island. Frank tried hard to rescue his brothers and did not think of himself until they had gone down for the last time. Then Frank struck out for the nearest land, and was at his last gasp when he reached Pancake Island. All was blank to him from that time until 4:30 when a sailboat party saw him, and brought him in. Frank told his rescuers what had happened, and they went to the spot. The canoe was found, but there was not a sign of the two boys. Word was taken to the Hamilton cottage. The sorrow there may be imagined. Meanwhile, the guests and employees of the Wawa Hotel, with cottagers and campers, dived and dragged for the bodies. Even darkness did not interrupt the work, as a Wawa Hotel flashlight was operated at night. Men worked in relays all night long and others took their places yesterday. Mrs. Hamilton is a sister of James Kent of Madison and John G. Kent of Glen View apartments, both late of the firm of Gowans, Kent & Co., and her uncle was the late John Gowans of the same firm. Mr. Hamilton has for over eight years been pastor of the Presbyterian Church in Weston, so the six boys have grown up there and are well known as a lively, manly lot, foremost in all sorts of sports and universally liked. Henry Hamilton, aged 19, a brother of the drowned boys, is a cashier in the dining-room of the Niagara Navigation Co.'s steamer Corona. He learned of the tragedy yesterday morning on his way to Toronto.

### WANT INSTRUMENTS BACK

Man Who Has Served His Time Says He Owns Them.

Judge Denton presided at a case in the county court yesterday in which Theodore Winkelhofer was suing Whaley, Royce & Co. in connection with the ownership of certain musical instruments. Nearly every desk in the courtroom was covered with flutes, clarinets, etc.

The action arises out of a previous case in which the musical firm charged the plaintiff with the theft of a certain number of instruments. At the time Winkelhofer pleaded guilty to stealing some of them and was sentenced to six months in the Central. He has since served his time and he now asks that the instruments found in his room and since held by the crown be returned to him.

The case was not concluded and will be continued next Wednesday week.

### COLONIAL VOLUNTEERS CAN BE ADDED TO THE NAVAL RESERVE

LONDON, Aug. 23.—(C.A.P.)—The bill to amend the Colonial Naval Defence Act gives power to the proper legislative authority of each colony to provide that volunteers raised in the colony shall form part of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, and that seamen and others raised and maintained by the colony shall be bound to general service in emergency. The bill gives power to authorize the admiralty to accept any offer from a colony to place at the disposal for general service of the navy the whole or any part of the volunteers or seamen with all or any of their officers.

### Will Pay Old Debts.

Application was made to the surrogate court by Robert Gallagher of Caradoc, Middlesex, Ont., yesterday for permission to advertise for creditors having claims against the estate of his late father, who died in 1893. At the time of his death it was thought the estate was not worth anything, but it is now known to be worth sufficient to pay \$625 to each of the three children, two daughters and the applicant. The court suggested that Mr. Gallagher locate the sisters, who were last heard of in Toronto in 1894, rather than advertise.

### Sixty Days For Forgery.

George Rutledge pleaded guilty to forging a cheque for \$2 when jailed in police court yesterday morning. He was sent to jail for 60 days. William Paradine was sent to the Central Prison for six months for theft of a chatelain. Michel Corcoran was sent to jail for 15 days for stealing William Maher's horse.

### Druggist Fined.

For employing a man who was not a graduate of the College of Pharmacy to take charge of a branch store, W. A. Twiddy, who has a store at the corner of Yonge-street and Eglington-avenue, was fined \$20 and costs by Magistrate Ellis yesterday morning.

Imperial Bank Will Build. The Imperial Bank has bought the northeast corner of Bloor and Dundas from Wm. Barber for \$13,000. The property is 243 feet by 190. It is expected the bank will build on the corner.

WITH BULLET IN HER HEAD GIVES BIRTH TO A CHILD. WESTBRIDGEWATER, Mass., Aug. 23.—After sending a bullet thru the head of his wife Mary, who was afterwards taken to the Brockton Hospital, where she gave birth to a child, Mariame Janeiro, committed suicide. Janeiro, who was 29 years old, was out of work and deranged mentally by account of sickness.

After dragging his wife from the kitchen to the top of the house, he kissed her good-bye while she struggled to get away, and then fired. The man placed the revolver to his own head just as his three children rushed up at the sound of the first shot. Laying down his weapon he kissed them, put them out of the room, locked the door and then blew out his brains.

The infant and mother are expected to live.

Raid on the Camorra. MILAN, Aug. 23.—The Marquis Arthur Azzariti, the newly installed head of the Naples Camorra, has been captured together with twenty-three members of the grand council, which elected him.

The 34 members of the council were holding a banquet to celebrate the election of the marquis when they were surprised by a squad of carabinieri. Ten of the men escaped.
