LONG SHOTS IN FRONT SECOND DAY AT FT. ERIE

Faux Col Only Favorite in Front—Horses and Jockeys in Spill in Second Race.

PORT ERIE, July 5.—The form players got an awful jolt when the second day's racing of the Niagara Racing Association took place. Only one public choice, Faux Col, came home in front.

The mutuels paid long prices on several. Shopkeepers rewarded the few that backed her with \$172.20 for a two-dollar ticket; Billy Frew, \$67.70; Katenka, \$13.10; Outlook, \$18.80; and Easter Lily, \$12.10, were the other long ones.

There was a serious spill in the second, a flat race, as the field was nearing the stretch turn. Olyn G. who was closing stoutly on the inside, tumbled and fell, turning a complete somersault. Jockey Wolstenholme, who had the mount, was thrown heavily and received a bad shaking. Gratitude fell over the prostrate horse, and Jockey McKenna was sent hurtling through the air, also receiving a bad shaking. Fox Trot stumbled over Wolstenholme, suffered the loss of several teeth and his shoulder was badly injured, although he was not broken. He will be unable to ride for some time. Jockey McKenna escaped with a shaking. Summary:
