Times of discouragement are almost invariably succeeded by something to warm and cheer the heart; were it not so it would scarcely be possible to continue. We have much to thank our Heavenly Father for, and we pray that His watchful Providence will guide the faltering footsteps of these often worse than orphaned girls into the paths of purity and peace.
