

In regard to those Divisions that are not in working order and have not accepted of the offer made to them by direction of this Grand Division, I would recommend that a Committee be appointed to take the subject into consideration, and take such steps in relation to each case as they may deem advisable to report at the Annual Session.

At the Session of the National Division, held at New Haven Conn. on 14th June last, it was decided to hold its next Session, (1866,) in the City of Montreal. It now becomes our duty to make preparation for the proper reception of the members of that Body, and I trust that we shall be enabled to give them such a reception as will be creditable to the Sons of Temperance of Canada East, and prove to our Brothers, who live south of the line 45, that though our climate be cold our hearts are warm. I would suggest that a Committee be appointed for the purpose of raising the ways and means.

From the Financial statement accompanying this Report, it will be seen that our receipts since last annual session amount to \$102.18, and our disbursements to \$102.94, shewing an apparent small deficiency. It must be observed however, that one of the items of disbursement (the per capita tax to National Division) although only paid during the past term, is really a part of the expenditure for 1864, and amounts to \$20.54, which if deducted from the amount of disbursements would give a surplus of income over expenditure of about \$20. It must also be taken into consideration that the per capita tax is still due for the quarter ending 31st March last, from 7 Divisions not reporting, but believed in working order.
