


DEATH DEALING CONTRIVANCES

Used in D. W. Griffith's "Intolerance" Similar To "Tanks" of Medern Warfare

The monthly meeting of the board of management of the Children's Aid Society was held last night in the Shelter, Elliot row, the president, A. M. Belding, in the chair. It was announced that the new matron, Mrs. A. L. Peatman, would assume management November 5. In better can be done to mothers who neglect their children than send them to jail. Several members contended that legislation should be sought making it possible to commit such women to an institution where they would be compelled to do hard work.

Regarding the general work of the society last night's discussion showed that it will be seriously handicapped until it has a home large enough to proride a hospital wing. Following is a summary of the agent's

"The work of the children's shelter during the past month has been carried on under some little difficulty but never-theless a good deal has been accomplished. Five children were admitted of whom two were taken over from their parents who were breaking up house-keeping preperatory to leaving the city. These had to be placed in the General Public Hospital, one of them suffering from a form of skin disease; the other from anemia brought on by neglect. The other three children were put in the shelter Wednesday. The mother is in jail on remand. She has five children two of whom are being cared for by relatives. The three lads put in the shelter were insufficiently clad, filthy


