

Mr. Butler, in a letter dated Nov. 21, 1910, gave the analysis of the limestone on the property of Mr. Adams as containing 96.74 per cent calcium carbonate. Again, Mark H. Spaulding, general manager of the Miramichi Pulp & Paper Company, Limited, in a letter dated Dec. 18, 1917, gave the calcium carbonate of the rock at Brookville as 94.53 per cent.

the interests of the opposition party, which sought to make it appear that the lime fertilizer was not of proper value. The government had protected the people from every viewpoint in regard to the manufacture of lime fertilizer, both as to its quality and as to its price, and such misstatements as had been made, for the sake of political advantage, would not impress the electors to the disadvantage of the administration.

Premier Foster also touched on Workmen's Compensation Act, saying that so long as he was in power the act would operate; he referred to the would operate; he referred to the stumpage question, the development of hydro-electric power in the province and gave his pledge and his honor that if returned with his colleagues he would carry through every policy he had announced to a successful conclusion.

With regard to a further tightening of the prohibition act, he said that, if returned, he would bring before the house the question of restricting absolutely the importation of intoxicants into the province. In this regard he always held that a moral question should not be made a political issue and he would not compel any one to use other than his own judgment in regard to the matter, as he believed that every individual has the right to say what he (Continued on page 7, first column.)
