RECRUITING NOTES FROM VARIOUS PARTS OF CANADA

Montreal, Nov. 7.—The last full
Montreal company of the 22nd Battalion
the "Royal Canadians," left for the reg-
imental barracks at St. John's this week.
The company which is being recruited
for the regiment at Quebec is expected
to reach Montreal in a day or two, and
will proceed to St. John's together with
the further details recruited here. These
additions will more than bring the bat-
talion to full strength.

Brookville, Nov. 7.—Brookville con-
tributed fifty-two soldiers to that portion
of the second contingent being assembled
at Kingston. The local regiment was
requested to enroll only 38 but even by
selecting only the best that presented
themselves for enrollment the officers
could not make the number less than
two over the half hundred mark.

Edmonton, Alta. Nov. 7.—The call which
was issued for one hundred men to force
a special draft to be sent to Montreal
for the 101st Edmonton Fusiliers. The
one hundred men to form a special
draft to be sent to Montreal has been
answered at the recruiting offices of the
101st Edmonton Fusiliers. The one hun-
dred men are now prepared to leave
for Calgary, whence they will be sent
to Montreal and attached for duty.

Coburg, Ont. Nov. 7.—One hundred
and fifteen members of the 40th North-
umberland regiment, under Captain
Wolfram, of Castleton, left for camp
at Kingston.

Peterboro, Ont. Nov. 7.—Seventy-nine
recruits, four beyond the quota required
of the 57th regiment, entrained at the
C. F. R. station for the concentration
camp at Kingston.
