### REPORT OF EXAMINING COMMITTEE.

The Report of the Examining Committee was read by Dr. Cook, bearing that the Committee bave been much gratified with the appearances made in both written and oral examinations by Messrs. John Gordon, William Hamilton, Thomas Hart, Alexander Hunter, Hugh Lamont, James C. Smith, and James McCaul, and that they recommend that leave be granted to their Presbyteries to take them on trials for License. Leave was granted, and the Presbyteries of Kingston, Ottawa, Peth, and Guelph were authorized, when met by permission of Synod,
