whether the instructions of the Committee had been neglected or exceeded; and further the expenditure could be better controlled, so as not to go beyond the amount in the Treasurer's hands.

During the past year they have disbursed the sum of \$955.39, including 2181 loaves, and 23 cords of wood, the relief being extended to 446 cases.
