

month. This deduction is granted for board only and never for tuition, etc. Special agreements should be renewed annually, otherwise they are void.

The mending of shoes and outside clothes is charged to parents. A deposit should be made to the Bursar for that purpose.

The Doctor's fees and infirmary charges are extra. Parents who wish to subscribe their children to a physician can do so by paying \$1.50 per annum.

Checks, money orders, etc., should be made to the order of **Bourget College** and addressed to the Bursar.

Discipline.

The scholastic year is divided into two terms, each of which is concluded by serious examinations.

Reports are sent monthly to parents or guardians, informing them of the conduct, application and progress of their children or wards. The best time for admission is at the beginning of September, but applicants will be received at any time during the scholastic year.

Parents are requested to visit their children only during recreations and on Tuesdays and Thursdays from one o'clock till five. Pupils are not allowed to go to the parlor during class or study.

Religion being the base and principal object of education and society, consequently, a complete course of religious instruction is pursued in the College.

The Religion of Protestant Students is not interfered with ; but for the sake of good order and uniformity, all have to follow the general exercises of the college (excepting catechism class).

Morality is watched over with the greatest care and attention.

The ordinary causes of expulsion are insubordination ; continued inappreciation to study ; the use of intoxicating liquors ; habitual profanity of language ; and grave offenses against morality and discipline.

Books, newspapers, correspondence, etc., are subject to the President's perusal.

No certificate of studies will be granted unless the pupil passes the regular examinations and settles with the Bursar.

Special attention is given to the young boys' department.

Pupils who follow the "English Commercial Course" in Bourget College are capable to pass a successful "Qualifying or Higher Grade Examination" for entrance into the Civil service of Canada.

Emulation.

There exists in the College a good system of emulation. Besides the goods, marks, premiums, medals, distinctions, sodalities, etc, there is a \$100.00 premium awarded for excellent deportment during ten months. There is also a \$30.00 prize granted for the same purpose. These two extraordinary premiums are drawn at the end of the last term ; the former consists of one year's board and tuition free ; the latter of one year's tuition free.

Only the pupils who arrive on the first day of the first term have a chance on the two extra premiums of excellent deportment.
