visitors, and several of her sketches  
have also been warmly praised. Miss  
Harris shows herself strong in por-  
traiture and technique, and her "Vic-  
tory" and the drawing of Venus are  
remarkably good.This year's effective part of the  
exhibit in the museum is the display  
of work by pupils of the Sackville  
High School. When it is remembered  
that these pupils devote but a short  
time each week to this work, the  
showing this year must be conceded  
to be remarkably praiseworthy.No part of the exhibit is being more  
admired than that of china painting.  
The display includes pieces of the  
simpler branches of china painting,  
as well as examples of the more ad-  
vanced work. Miss Ethel Borden of  
Halifax, makes a particularly credit-  
able showing in her work, while  
Miss Elaine Borden, of Sackville, and  
Miss Lilian Fisher, of Chatham, are  
exhibiting some very pretty jardi-  
ners. A vase painted by Miss Chase  
among the most charming  
bits of work shown while plate in-  
lustrate by Miss Ida Fawcett, of Sack-  
ville, has been much praised. Miss  
Lillian Fisher, of Chatham, has a bowl  
with bird decoration, which has also  
been the object of a good deal of  
admiring attention.This year's unusual interest has been  
shown by many pupils, and the bene-  
fit of the exhibition in the museum  
in designing. This branch of  
the work has been under the direc-  
tion of Miss Elaine Borden and the  
exhibit now made reflects credit on  
her as upon all who have been un-  
der her instruction. The exhibits show  
various problems in line, tone and  
color and wood block printing.In wood carving the exhibit includes  
a striking oak chest and mahogany  
box made by Miss Margaret Harris,  
of Pictou. Miss Borden also exhibits  
a handsomely executed red cedar  
chest.Miss Mabel Andrews, of Sackville,  
shows a handsome cushion in leather  
work, while a snapshot book in stained  
leather by Miss Nellie Williams,  
of St. John, is one of the prettiest of  
the many pretty bits of work shown.  
A desk set by Miss Nan Chapman,  
of Moncton, is also exceptionally well  
done.In metal work this year the class  
has been larger than usual and a  
high standard has been set and main-  
tained. Miss Leah Borden, of Lower  
Canada, N. S., displays a copper tray  
of unique design which has been cri-  
tiqued very favorably, and Miss Nel-  
lie Turner, of Sackville, shows a par-  
ticularly good vase and copper lantern.  
Miss Chris Harris is showing a very  
pretty copper box and Miss Leah Bor-  
den and Miss Elaine Borden show  
one, a silver pendant set with tur-  
quoise matrix and a pendant set in  
lapis lazuli. Both these  
pendants are far above the average of  
excellence in this work. A silver
