SUN LIFE'S BIG YEAR.

Substantial increases in the amount of business done, in income, assets and surplus are shown in a report just completed of the Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada for the year 1911. Figures were given recently of the amount of new assurance written during the year. A laterstatement shows the total amount of assurance in force at the end of the year to have been \$164,572,073, an increase of \$21,022,787 over the amount in force in 1910. The income of the company has grown to \$10,557,335, an increase of \$81,881, or about 12.5 per cent., while the excess of income over expenditure was \$5,180,452 in 1911. Assets have been increased by \$5,736,095 and now amount to \$43,990,885, while the surplus of the company stands at \$4,717,073, or over 19 per cent, higher than a year ago. Profits paid to policy-holders during the year amounted to nearly half a million dollars. Some of the principal figures from the company's report of the year's operations are:
