

## TRAIN HAS 2 ACCIDENTS IN ONE DAY

Caboose of Freight Damaged at Sackville, and Later Double-Header Kills Two Horses Near Dorchester.

Dorchester, Jan. 16.—An unfortunate accident occurred at the C. G. R. station at Upper Dorchester this afternoon at 3:30 o'clock. Napoleon LeBlanc, employed as teamster for Joseph R. Taylor, ex-county councillor of Taylor village, while approaching the station with a load of potatoes, lost control of his horses through the breaking of the knees. The animals, young and full of life, becoming panic-stricken, rushed directly in front of an approaching freight train driven by two locomotives and running at a high rate of speed. One animal was killed instantly and the other died in less than half an hour. The teamster escaped injury. Mr. Taylor regards his loss as serious. No blame is in any way attached to the train hands. The same train had a mix-up at Sackville and was hauling a damaged "caboose."

SCHOONER OVERDUE.

Boston, Jan. 15.—Schr. ## SIR JOHN HENDRIE IN FAVOR OF INCOME TAX

President of Bank of Hamilton Also Believes in Tax on Expenditure.

Toronto, Jan. 16.—Sir John Hendrie, president of the Bank of Hamilton, at the annual meeting said in part: "The purchasing power of money has declined sharply, and a dollar will not purchase anything like as much as it did two years ago. There is urgent need of economy and thrift. This condition cannot last forever, but it provides one of the strongest incentives to save as every dollar now in hand will be worth more when normal conditions return."

The general manager suggested that the government should put on an income tax, graded to circumstances of the people, and also a tax on expenditures.
