the countries of the world are
basking in the feeling of vic-
tory, but we are to prove that
we are wrong. We must live, we must
defeat our enemies, and for that
the country must bear every
thing that we, the leaders, shall
impose upon it. Even if the
majority of the population of
the country should perish from cold and
starvation, the rest of us will go on
for the glory of the world revolution."
