

THE REFUSAL TO INVESTIGATE THE CHARGES BY E. S. CARTER

Correspondence Between Mr. Carter and Mr. Commissioner Chandler Regarding the Liquor Hold-Up, the "Patriotic" Potatoes and Other Matters.

At the last session of Royal Commissioner Chandler's court of inquiry E. S. Carter, the opposition organizer, laid certain facts with respect to the purchase of the patriotic potatoes and the expenditure of \$150,000 before him and said that he would make the charges formally before his next meeting.

A few days later he was notified by the commissioner that he would be unable to investigate this matter because of other business engagements. Mr. Carter's reply and Mr. Chandler's letter place the matter fairly before the public.

One fact must, however, stand out plainly, Mr. Chandler is retiring from the business of investigation.

Dear Sir,—I find that business matters which require my immediate attention will make it impossible for me to devote more time to investigations as commissioner. The best I can do is to wind up the matters into which I have already inquired and take the evidence of those witnesses whom Mr. Veniot desires to have examined.

Under these circumstances I shall not be able to take up any new matters for investigation and therefore cannot do anything with respect to the matter to which you lately called my attention.

Mr. Carter's Reply.

Fair Vale, Kings Co., N. B., August 25, 1915.
W. B. Chandler, Esq., K. C., Royal Commissioner, Moncton, N. B.

Dear Sir,—I beg to acknowledge the receipt of yours of the 20th inst. and to note the reasons you give why you will be unable to investigate the expenditure of about \$150,000 for the purchase of patriotic potatoes, to which I called your attention at the last session of your court.

I am much surprised and disappointed, for your acceptance of the appointment of royal commissioner led me to believe that you would continue the work until it was completed. I have asked you to investigate several charges and you have only consented to inquire into one of them—the Dalhousie Lumber Company stampage payment—and even that you at first refused.

One charge that the former superintendent of sealers was bribed by lumbermen; another that individuals and firms licensed by the government to sell liquor were asked or compelled to pay large sums of money by close friends of the government, while legislation affecting their interests was under consideration, you refused to consider, and this charge—most important of all—that the large sum of \$150,000 given to us by Governor Wood's own words in his report "as a token of the loyalty of the people of this province to the motherland," was improperly expended and largely wasted and diverted for the profit of men friendly to the government, you say you will not be able to take up because of other engagements.

Once more let me remind you of the words of the premier of the province, when he introduced you to the people of New Brunswick, his first speech in the legislature when he said: "This court will open to every man, woman and child who has any complaint to prefer."

Also let me quote the words of the first law officer of the province and the crown, Hon. Attorney-General Baxter, when at your first sitting after your appointment as royal commissioner had been read, he addressed you and those present and, through the press, the people of New Brunswick, saying:

"If any person has reason to believe that there is anything wrong in any of the departments, although he may not have any knowledge himself which will bear out his belief, he will be welcome to communicate his belief or what he has heard to the commissioner, and every facility will be given for the complete investigation of any such reports. Even if there is but a suspicion of wrong the government will be glad to have that suspicion communicated so that persons who may have knowledge may be summoned to appear. He will not be bound by the strict rules of evidence but the commissioner has authority to use any methods he may deem to be in the public interest. If there are any charges or beliefs or suspicions now is the time to make them known."

In the face of these statements, Mr. Commissioner, how can you refuse me these investigations? If words have any meaning, you were appointed to inquire into any and all matters concerning which there was even a suspicion of wrong doing. Am I to understand that the premier and attorney-general did not mean what they said?

My associate, Mr. Veniot, has had no trouble getting you to investigate charges which concerned operations in the public works department, one into a farm settlement board purchase, and one into a stampage matter. But these larger and more important matters, to which I have directed your attention, you refuse to inquire into.

Why? I have a right, Mr. Commissioner, to ask this question, because I and other friends of good government were led to believe you were an independent royal commissioner who would not be swayed from the purpose and scope of your appointment as laid by the premier and the attorney-general of the province, nor permit private engagements to interfere with what must appear to you, after hearing the evidence in other charges, as a serious public duty.

A Further Request.

Dear Sir,—Yours of the 26th received.

My personal approval of your course as commissioner has nothing to do with the matter in question to which I am acting on behalf of the opposition party in New Brunswick and claim the right to know why you refuse to inquire into certain charges which are so important that they touch the very foundation of our government. Surely allegations concerning the bribery of officials, the contributions of provincial licensees and the diversions of a large sum of public money intended to express the loyalty of the people—surely these are matters that you, appointed a royal commissioner to inquire into the conduct of officials and the operations of the government departments, should have no hesitation in investigating.

Referring to your statement that some of the matters to which I called your attention in the past were entirely outside the terms of your commission, may I point out that your written authority seems to be entirely different from the interpretation given it by the premier and the attorney-general when assuring the public that "any man, woman or child could prefer a complaint" before you and that you, as commissioner, had authority to use any methods he may deem to be in the public interest?

I ask you again, in that public interest, which these members of the government had so much in their minds, when they announced your appointment as royal commissioner, to investigate my charges that the crown land licensees gave the superintendent of sealers large sums as gifts or bribes; that liquor licensees contributed large amounts while their business was under consideration in the legislature; and that the \$150,000 given by the people of New Brunswick for a loyal and patriotic purpose was largely wasted and diverted for the purpose intended. 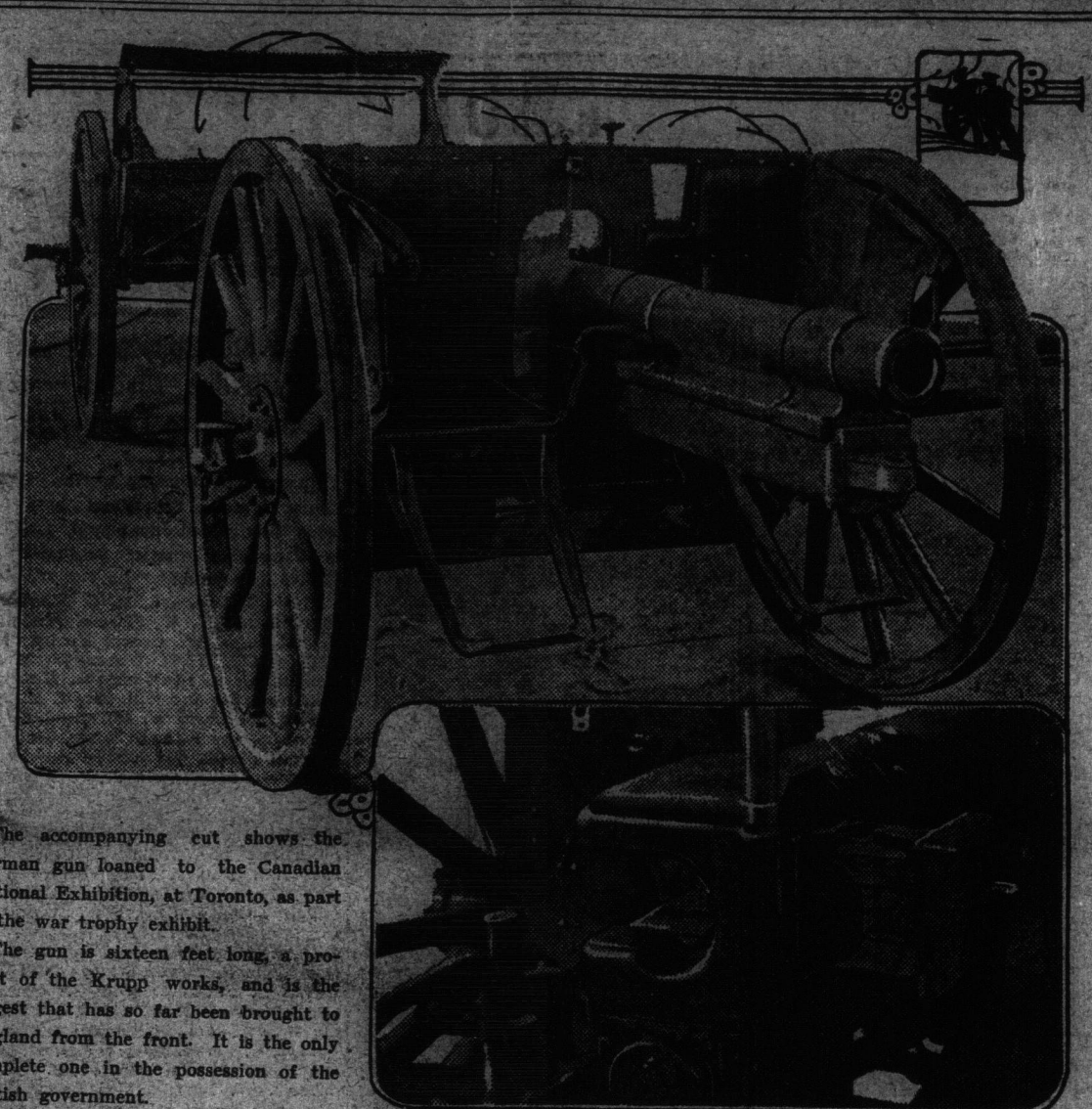
Long Delayed Payment.

ROBLIN CHARGED WITH CONSPIRACY TO DEFRAUD MANITOBA

Winnipeg, Aug. 31.—The expected sequel to the report of the Mathers commission on the parliament buildings scandal occurred this afternoon when four ministers of the late government, Sir Rodmond Roblin, premier; Dr. W. H. Montague, minister of public works; James Howden, attorney-general; and George R. Caldwell, minister of education, submitted themselves to the authorities at the city police station.

They were released on \$50,000 bail each, \$25,000 being personal security. For Sir Rodmond, Aime Benard, present leader of the Conservative party in the legislature, and Dr. E. Sprague, ex-chief of the license commission, were bondsman for the other \$25,000.

Dr. Montague, for Mr. Howden, George Hamilton, of Neepawa, and Stephen B. Stonehouse, and for Mr. Caldwell, Alex. Reid and Andrew Simpson.

The ex-ministers will appear in the city police court tomorrow morning to answer the charge of conspiring to defraud the public. They will then be remanded.

An early date will be set for the preliminary hearing. More charges may, and very likely will be, laid, according to R. A. Bonnar, K. C., who is acting for the prosecution.

Warrants had been issued for the arrest of the men, but as they came forward voluntarily they were not served. They were taken to the city police station where they were held incommunicado.

R. A. Bonnar, seen after the proceedings were finished, explained that the ex-ministers had been admitted to bail, and that they would appear in court tomorrow morning. A remand would then be asked for by the defence, and a date set for the preliminary hearing, which would likely be soon. The present charges were for conspiring to defraud the public, and other charges, possibly of destroying public documents, might be laid later.

The out of door pleasure was cut short after 7 o'clock by a steady downpour of rain, so that the prettily arranged booths were removed to Mr. Gowland's carriage house. Miss M. J. Gaynor, the secretary-treasurer of the Red Cross Society here, reports the net proceeds to be \$86.

Halifax, Aug. 30.—Captain Edward O'Toole, commander of the British steamer Silver Wings, which wrecked on Sable Island, August 17, has had his captain's certificate suspended for a period of one year from August 30, 1915, to August 30, 1916. The court, however, recommended that he be given a master's certificate during the period under suspension.

The Silver Wings struck a sand bar off Sable Island on August 17 and came a total wreck. She was loaded with steel for Russia and was bound from New York to Archangel when stranded.

This is the opinion Dr. C. E. Saunders, dominion cerealist, has of the crops in the western fields. He was in the city last night, at the Royal, and will leave this morning for Fredericton to inspect the dominion experimental farm there.

Continuing, regarding the outlook in the western fields, Dr. Saunders said: "There has been a greater acreage of seed put in this season, due in part to the failure of the crops last year and the realized pressing demand for wheat and grain through the war. The crops have been backward, though, on account of the bad weather in the early summer. If frost doesn't strike in for the next two weeks until the harvest is in, then it will be a success."

Concerning the recent severe electrical storms in the west, which, according to reports, have thrashed down large areas of wheat and grain, Dr. Saunders said that allowances are made for such things and in every instance the losses are local. There are no general ill effects.

Dr. Saunders has been making his annual inspection of the dominion experimental farms. He was particularly well pleased with the crops at the farm in Charlottetown and in Kentville, too, which, they were very good. The only dominion experimental farm in New Brunswick is at Fredericton and he goes there today to make observations.
