GOT GOOD PRICE BULGARIA AGAIN FACES TROUBLE FOR DEBENTURES

City Disposes of Issue of Revolution Threatened If At-\$159,000 At 98.64.

ST. THOMAS, March 9.—A sale of debentures amounting to \$159,000 has been made by City Treasurer Perry to a local brokerage firm in Toronto. A portion of the block bears interest at 5½, and the later issue at 6 per cent. The price received, 98.64. The city treasurer considers it the most satisfactory in months, and at a time, too, when the bond market was so unsettled. The total bond issues of a recent period was \$358.00, and about \$200,000 of these were disposed of to St. Thomas investors. The local buyers, says Mr. Perry, preferred short term bonds, and these being exhausted, the treasurer had to turn to outside firms for a sale of the remainder. In the sale of the block to the Toronto brokers the city will net \$156,844, or a fraction over 6 per cent.

Yarmouth Has Surplus.

The township of Yarmouth has a surplus of \$4,089, in the year's business, and that the rate of taxation may be lower than that of last year, the estimates compiled of the money to be spant on road improvements will be reconsidered.
