

The election list was to be closed on the 20th April. The National Guards were to elect their own officers; grenadier and volunteer companies were to be suppressed. All foreigners of five years' residence are declared entitled to naturalization.

The Duke and Duchess of Montpensier having caused some surprise by leaving England soon after they had arrived there in safety, and proceeding to Belgium, a report gained ground to the effect that some documents had fallen into the hands of the French Provisional Government, which implicated the Duke and Duchess in very peculiar transactions.

It is the intention of the Government, we understand, to arrange with the Comptroller of Customs, as far as practicable, to receive monies hitherto paid at the Excise. If this is effected, the cost of Collection at Halifax will probably be reduced from £700 a year to 500 0 0.

This is described as a saving of upwards of £700 upon the old system; of course subject to the result of the experiment whether the business of the Province can be conducted with the staff of officers then provided.
