

All extra articles required beyond those noted above must be paid for at the time requisition is made.

The Great Coats which were issued to the Volunteers prior to the 1st of April, 1866, are the property of the Government, and must be returned into store when they become unserviceable.

Officers making requisition upon the Department for Great Coats, are required to account for former issues to their corps, before new ones can be forwarded.

Requisitions for clothing must be made upon the proper printed form. Copies of which may be obtained from any Brigade Major—These forms, when filled up, are to be addressed to the Militia Department, Ottawa, and on the upper left hand corner of the envelope, the words "clothing branch," should be written.

Uniform clothing for the Volunteers is made up in assorted sizes and if care is taken in making requisition, very few, if any, alterations will be required when it is taken into wear. Officers are reminded that clothing can only be supplied of the dimensions noted in the size roll.

Officers Commanding Corps which have received issues of clothing on repayment, will be furnished at the beginning of each financial year with a statement, showing the value of clothing charged against the corps during the preceding year, the sums credited on account, and the balance remaining due to the Government.

When clothing is sent by Rail or Steamboat from Ottawa, a written requisition for transport is given to accompany the packages, which requisition is to be
