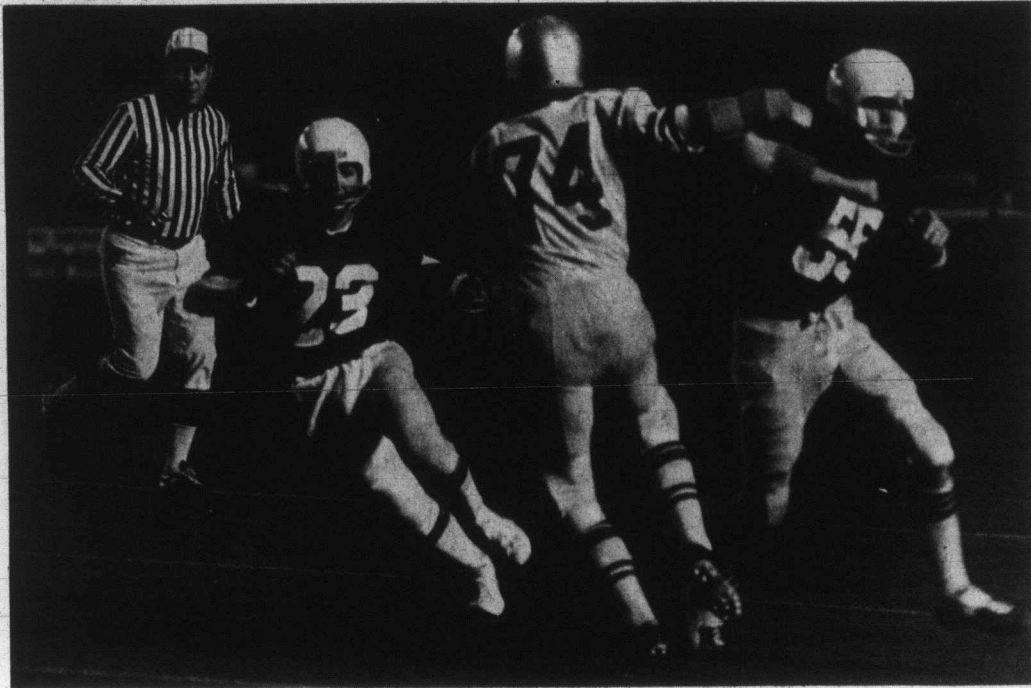


Kougars avenge loss to Spartans in final

"Nobody beats us twice," shouted a jubilant T. L. Kennedy player after the Kougars defeated Lorne Park Spartans 21-6 in the Peel County Junior Football Championships at CNE Stadium last week.

Kennedy had lost only one game during the regular season and that was a 13-9 decision by Spartans.

Kennedy's revenge was spearheaded by Mike Gora and Jim Wong on the offence and Sylvio Catalano on defence.

The ubiquitous Catalano figured in some 90 per cent of the defensive plays, at times cutting the Spartans' running attack to ribbons.

In the first quarter, Lorne Park's drive led by John Musselman and Bob Midgette was stopped when Catalano intercepted a pass in the end zone and brought it to Kougars' three yard line.

Despite Greg MacKenzie's running efforts, Spartans' Ross Buckle and Mike Wright forced Kougars to punt.

In the second quarter, another Kougars' drive was stopped when Lorne Park's Randy Brown intercepted a pass and returned it to the Kougars' 13 yard line.

Kougars' defensive line led by some hard hitting by Rob Villa held their ground and

Spartans attempted a field goal which was blocked by Dwight Beaton.

Jim Wong and Mike Gora started piling on yards for Kennedy and late in the quarter Wong's touchdown was nullified on a penalty.

Both teams went into the dressing room with the score tied 0-0.

The hard hitting continued into the third quarter.

Spartans' break came when two penalties moved the ball down to the Kougars' 33 yard line. From that point, the efforts of Musselman, Jay Moulton and Bob McCullough put the ball on the half yard line. Quarterback Greg Holmes struck pay dirt on a keeper play to put the Spartans ahead.

Kougars took the ball in good field position when Darryl Melynk returned the kickoff 25 yards and a penalty moved the ball to Lorne Park's 44 yard line.

With just over two minutes

left in the quarter, Gora scampered into the end zone on a sweep set up by a Mike Hanafin block and Catalano converted.

A costly Spartans mistake gave Kougars the ball deep in Lorne Park territory. Holmes, who could not find a receiver open was caught 40 yards behind the line of scrimmage and his fumble was recovered by Larry Wade on Spartans' 33 yard line at the end of the third quarter.

Kougars could not capitalize, however, and had to settle for a single point kicked by Robinson.

On the next series of downs, Spartans could not move the ball and their punt was blocked by Fred Martin and recovered by Kougars on Lorne Park's one yard line.

Robinson put six more points on the scoreboard for Kougars on a keeper and Catalano split the uprights for the single point.

Robinson recovered his

own punt but the relentless pressure of Spartans' Buckle and Phil Frendergast forced Kougars to give up the ball.

Then Rod McMillan blocked the kick and took the ball to the Kougars' 27 yard line.

Spartans' come back hopes were short lived, however, when a reverse pass option was intercepted by Hanafin.

With less than three minutes remaining, Gora scored the final Kougars touchdown on a sweep that went 45 yards and was sprung by a key block by Greg MacKenzie.

"The defence played its best game today," announced a tired but jubilant Catalano afterwards.

"They're a closely matched team," said Lorne Park coach Jack Gibbins. "They capitalized on their breaks and we didn't."

"We just tried to eliminate our mistakes and go with the same plays we used all year," said winning coach Bud Wilson.

Broncos win midget crown with last minute major

T. L. Kennedy must have wished they could have added their exhibition play score to their final tally.

The Kougars lost to Bramalea Broncos 7-6 in the final minutes of play in the Peel County Midget Football Championships at CNE Stadium last week.

For most of the first two quarters, a tough defensive battle kept both teams out of striking position.

Bramalea's defence led by Brad Corrie stopped a Kougars drive in the second

quarter. The field goal attempt was then blocked by Corrie.

Kougars' Sterling Hinds picked up a Broncos' fumble but Kennedy was unable to advance the ball and the half ended.

During the exhibition play between the second teams, Keith Henderson went 40 yards for a Kennedy touchdown.

The third quarter of play saw some hard hitting by both defensive squads highlighted by long punts from Kougars' John Mancini, and the period

ended with both teams scoreless.

Doug Gillis, Andy Danevicius, Ed Toss and Doug Kee proved to be tough on the Kougars' defence and Bramalea was forced to punt with five minutes left in the game.

Sterling Hinds and Owen Ivey moved the ball for Kennedy while Hinds carried the ball 15 yards on a sweep to the Broncos' one yard line.

Two plays later Hinds got a key block from Ralph Fonari and went in for a touchdown. What proved to be the key play of the game came when

Bramalea's Bill Byckowski blocked the convert attempt.

On their next series of downs, the running of Jamie Bath, Kevin Smith and Joe Spellen brought Bramalea to the Kennedy 13 yard line and a penalty moved them to the six.

Two plays later Smith went in for the touchdown and Tony McLoughlin converted.

"It's very tough to lose by one point in the last three minutes of the game," said Kougars' coach, Howard Hall. "They just took better advantage of their breaks."

NOTICE OF APPLICATION BY THE CORPORATION OF THE CITY OF MISSISSAUGA TO DISPENSE WITH A VOTE OF THE ELECTORS

WHEREAS the Ontario Municipal Board by Order E 751378 made on July 30, 1975 approved an application by the City of Mississauga for the construction of a sidewalk on Parkerhill Road from Dundas Street to cul-de-sac, at an estimated cost of \$16,000.00 all of which will be debentured.

AND WHEREAS it is now estimated that the actual cost of the said work will exceed such approved amount and that the total expenditure will be \$33,118.50 of which it will be necessary to borrow upon debentures the sum of \$33,118.50.

TAKE NOTICE THAT:

- The Council of the Corporation of the City of Mississauga intends to apply to The Ontario Municipal Board for approval of an additional expenditure of \$17,118.50 for completion of the said work, whereof the amount of \$17,118.50 shall be raised by the sale of additional debentures payable out of the general rate over a period not exceeding ten (10) years.
- Application will be made to The Ontario Municipal Board for an order to dispense with the assent of the electors to the said additional expenditure. Any ratepayer may, within twenty-one (21) days after the first publication of this notice, send by post prepaid to the Clerk of the City of Mississauga, at the address given below, a notice in writing stating his objections to such approval and the grounds of such objections.
- The Ontario Municipal Board may order pursuant to the statute that the assent of the electors shall not be required and may approve of the said additional expenditure, but before doing so it may appoint a time and place for a public hearing when any objections will be considered.
