

# It takes lots of green stuff to revel at the big hotels

A surprising number of people just want to hide on New Year's Eve. The noise, the partying, the over-abundance of food and drink are not their idea of a really good time. They opt for a fire in the fireplace, a good book or a quiet dinner for two — at home.

Many Mississaugans like house parties and these range from elegant dinners to teen-age rock parties. Even very small parties tend to be formal with the occasional hosts of small dinner parties asking the men to dust off the old dinner jacket.

Even in this year of recession, the hotels within a five-mile radius of Mississauga report brisk business.

The Newport Inn in Port Credit, starting its New Year's party at 8:30, will have a buffet dinner and dance with a door prize, spot prizes and party favors. Cost is \$30 a couple.

The Cara Inn, on the airport strip and also in Mississauga, is fully booked in Bishop's Landing. They are charging \$25 a couple for buffet, favors and dancing to Lou Snider.

At their Greenhouse Restaurant, with Bob Greer's trio providing the music, a sit-down dinner will cost \$50 a couple — and the room was fully booked earlier this month.

Also along the airport strip is Howard Johnson's. Their pub (sold out) charges \$40 a couple for a hot and cold buffet. The Red Coach dining room will have its regular menu, plus entertain-

ment and a \$5 cover charge. They are encouraging revellers to sleep over and offer a special room rate of \$20 if you are attending a function in the hotel.

The Skyline has four stops: The Cloud Room offers dinner, floor show, a free gift for \$85 a couple and a room available for \$20 with no charge for children in the room.

Runway 23 with Vanda King performing, is \$35. Kay Meredith will be singing at Diamond Lil's. The cost is \$17.50 per person and The Pub (singing along with Queen Anne and the Pearly Kings) is \$15 per person. All three rooms are offering hot and cold buffets.

Zachary's Dining Room at the Bristol Place will have a special dinner menu, starting at 7:30 with dancing to Eddie Sossin and featuring Holly Carroll, for \$80 a couple. Reservations are by ticket sales only.

In Dr. Livingstone's, with Los Amigos playing, will be nuts, gourmet snacks and party favors for \$20 per person.

In the Perroquet Pub, the Jax and Lynda Layne trio will play at \$15 per person.

The Bristol will provide complimentary coffee at its coffee station in the lobby after 12:45 a.m.

Attila's Cave at the Toronto Airport Hilton will have a seven-piece group (Jeanette Brantley and Second Wind). It seats 500, has three dance floors and will provide cold snacks and costs \$40 a couple.

The Candlelight Room (the main dining room) at the Hilton will entertain with the Night Stars Trio with a \$5 per person cover charge. They will also be serving a six-course dinner from 6 to 9 p.m. for \$15.25 to \$19.75 per person, depending on the main course you choose.

The Golden Hall banquet hall will have the five-piece B. G. Rankin Elastic Showband and serve a six-course dinner including wine and champagne for \$95 a couple. They also recommend imbibers stay overnight and offer the special rate of \$24 per room — children no charge.

The Atlantis Leaky Tap Lounge in the Avion Motor Hotel will charge \$8 per person for a hot and cold buffet and noisemakers starting at 8 p.m.

The Kon Tiki Lounge in the same hotel will have the same buffet, also charge \$8 and Kendall and Ward will be playing.

The Burgundy Room at the Constellation will feature the Bobby Shaw quartet, a floor show that will rotate with their other rooms and a six-course dinner. The cost is \$110 a couple and includes a complimentary room.

The Woodbine Room, with the O'Neil sisters, is \$76 a couple and includes a five-course dinner.

The Magic Carpet lounge (\$54 a couple) and the Banyan Terrace (\$40 a couple) have rooms available at a special rate of \$24, double occupancy.

## THE EXPROPRIATIONS ACT NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL TO EXPROPRIATE LAND

IN THE MATTER of an application by the Minister of Transportation and Communications for approval to expropriate lands being in the City of Mississauga, in the Regional Municipality of Peel, in the Province of Ontario, for the purpose of acquiring sufficient land to accommodate the construction of an interchange at Cawthra Road and the Queen Elizabeth Way and works related thereto.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that application has been made for approval to expropriate the land described in the schedule hereto.

Any owner of lands in respect of which notice is given who desires an inquiry into whether the taking of such land is fair, sound and reasonably necessary in the achievement of the objectives of the expropriating authority shall so notify the approving authority in writing:

- in the case of a registered owner, served personally or by registered mail within thirty days after he is served with the notice, or when he is served by publication, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice;
- in the case of an owner who is not a registered owner, within thirty days after the first publication of the notice.

### NOTES

- The Expropriations Act provides that:
  - where an inquiry is requested, it shall be conducted by an inquiry officer appointed by the Minister of Justice and Attorney General;
  - the inquiry officer:
    - shall give every party to the inquiry an opportunity to present evidence and argument and to examine and cross-examine witnesses, either personally or by his counsel or agent; and
    - may recommend to the approving authority that a party to the inquiry be paid a fixed amount for his costs of the inquiry not to exceed \$200 and the approving authority may in its discretion order the expropriating authority to pay such costs forthwith.

- "owner" and "registered owner" are defined in the Act as follows:
  - "owner" includes a mortgagee, tenant, execution creditor, a person entitled to a limited estate or interest in land, a committee of the estate of a mentally incompetent person or of a person incapable of managing his affairs, and a guardian, executor, administrator or trustee in whom land is vested;
  - "registered owner" means an owner of land whose interest in the land is defined and whose name is specified in an instrument in the proper Land Registry or Sheriff's office, and includes a person shown as a tenant of land on the last revised assessment roll.

- The expropriating authority, each owner who notifies the approving authority that he desires a hearing in respect of the lands intended to be expropriated and any owner added as a party by the inquiry officer are parties to the inquiry.

Mississaugan Rupert Antoine recently developed a new technique in art that he calls Aluminart.

## New concept in metal art developed by local artist

A Mississauga artist has designed a whole new concept in metal art. His craft, which he calls aluminart, is only two weeks old.

Rupert Antoine, 30, an architectural draftsman and an interior decorator, is currently a student at Ryerson in urban planning.

His work is graphic and stark. It consists of animals stenciled on an aluminum background which is painted a bright color and the animal is tooled to give it texture.

The aluminum is framed so that it can be used as a wall plaque or tray.

Antoine says he worked for four and a half months testing different metals and paints and chemicals until he could find the ones that were compatible.

He plans to patent the details of his art to allow him to recoup his enormous investment in time and money.

Coming from Trinidad seven years ago, Antoine worked as an architectural draftsman, but recently decided to go back to school.

To finance his way through Ryerson he decided to sell art and the idea for the metal graphics sort of hit him "all of a sudden," he says.

"The art is me, but urban planning is what society wants in the future," he said explaining his conflicting careers. The entire process of designing the art, the stencils and even a catalogue of designs people can order, is Antoine's alone.

He has 14 designs catalogued but will create anything a customer wants.

If someone wants an original piece of work, Antoine can guarantee it will not be duplicated.

To introduce the public to his work, he's designed a hospitality set which consists of a tray or wall plaque, a mounted coconut shell ashtray and four non-slip mahogany coasters. The ashtray and coasters are also mounted on the aluminart. The entire set is \$35.

Designing "something new that people haven't been

buying all these years is all that much more of a reward," he said.

Eventually Antoine hopes aluminart will become common and he plans to teach it.

This is just the beginning of this form of art, says Antoine. He is currently experimenting with new elements and see through paints. He hopes to create more complex works in the future.

In the meantime however he'll stick with his graphics of "Jaws" and dinosaurs. Why dinosaurs? "It's a tribute to ancient creatures, something in the past that is meaningful."
