Champion Gryphons dominate

1973 Peel high school senior football all-stars

Two players have been selected to both the offensive and defensive teams of the Peel county senior A football all-stars which is dominated by players from championship game finalists Glenforest and Erindale.

Port Credit's Ed McMahon, the only player named from his school, was picked as an offensive end and a defensive corner linebacker. Jim Dziedzina of Glenforest, the six-foot-four inch two-way player for the Gryphons, was named offensive tackle and defensive interior linebacker.

Senior A champion Glenforest named seven players to the all-stars while the team they beat, Erindale, had six players chosen, including middle linebacker

Larry Dallimore who was virtually a unanimous choice.

Four Lorne Park Spartans, three Applewood Axemen and two Gordon Graydon Hawks were also honoured.

In the senior B selections, the undefeated champion T.L. Kennedy Kougars completely dominated the all-stars as they did their regular season opponents naming 10 players — five offensively and five defensively. Finalist Clarkson had five players named.

On offence the Kougars' pair of offensive guards who led their devastating ground game were both chosen. Besides Lloyd Ahisaukas and Paul Salavarra, offensive end Paul Dekker was

also selected from the Kennedy front wall.

Quarterback Don Scott and burly fullback Tony Leonardi were the other Kougars Offensive selections. On defence, end Gary Heysbergen and tackle Paul Maudsley join linebackers Terry Venner and Joe Mancini and half-back Ben Van de Camp.

On the senior A offensive squad, Erindale and Glenforest each named four players. Guard Bruce Bob, tackle Dziedzina and end Dan Harris of the Gryphons were all named to the offensive line. Each of them performed both ways for the Gryphons throughout the year.

Fullback Sal Battaglia, their leading ground gainer, was the other selection.

Centre Dave Starrat and husky tackle John Burtort were the Erindale offensive linemen honoured. They were joined by first-year senior Steve McMurray who blossomed into a standout runner in 1973 and by flanker Dwight Edwards.

Edwards did more running than any other player from his blazer spot. He was called on to carry the ball on reverses innumerable times by the Raiders in crucial long yardage situations.

Flanker Lawrence Newhook of Gordon Graydon who along with wide receiver Sandy Gray paced the Hawks aerial attack was also chosen. Lorne Park Spartan quarterback Paul Ford, by far the best passer in the division was tabbed as the all-star signal caller.

The heart of the defensive alignment is deadly tackling

Larry Dallimore of Erindale, the mobile Dziedzina of Glenforest, McMahon of Port Credit and Anthony Dennis of Glenforest, all linebackers.

Jim Connolly of Erindale, who played an exceptional championship game and Applewood's Bob Clarke are the defensive tackles. Axeman Henry Verway from his team's impressive front four was named at end along with Lorne Park's Paul Blenkarn who made the switch from running back to defensive end this year.

Outstanding Gryphon back Kevin Aver joins Applewood's Norbert Wilging, Gordon Graydon's Dave Flynn and Lorne Park's Steve Ackroyd in the defensive secondary.

Flynn, another two-way player, missed his team's

first game but the co-captain played strongly for the rest of the season. Ackroyd distinguished himself with his hard-hitting, efficient tackling.

For the first time this year, players had a hand in the selection of the team, voting only for their opponents. Coaches, whose votes were weighed twice as heavily as the players, nominated from their own teams as well as selecting from opponents.

Convenor Mike McMahon said he was happy with the selections in that they "are fairly representative" of the best players although he admitted it is virtually impossible to make sure that every player deserving recognition becomes an all-star.

ANY PERSON wishing to support the application for approval of the by-law may, within fourteen (14) days after the date of this notice, send by registered mail or deliver to the Clerk of the Town of Oakville notice of his support of approval of the said by-law together with a request for notice of any hearing that may be held giving also the name and address to which such notice should be given.

THE ONTARIO MUNICIPAL BOARD may approve of the said by-law but before doing so it may appoint a time and place when any objection to the by-law will be considered. Notice of any hearing that may be held will be given only to persons who have filed an objection or notice of support and who have left with or delivered to the Clerk undersigned, the address to which notice of hearing is to be sent.

THE LAST DATE FOR FILING OBJECTIONS will be January 4, 1974.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF OAKVILLE BY-LAW NUMBER 1972-5

A by-law to amend By-law 1965-136 (Swimming Pools). THE COUNCIL ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. By-law 1965-136 is amended by deleting section 22. (2) and substituting therefor the following:

"(2) If in a side yard shall not be less than 25 feet from the side lot line except in the case of a corner lot where it may be within 12 feet of the flanking road or may be within 5 feet of the interior side lot line if no part of the pool is closer to the front lot line than the required front yard for the zone, plus 35 feet."

2. This by-law takes effect only upon its approval by the Ontario Municipal Board.

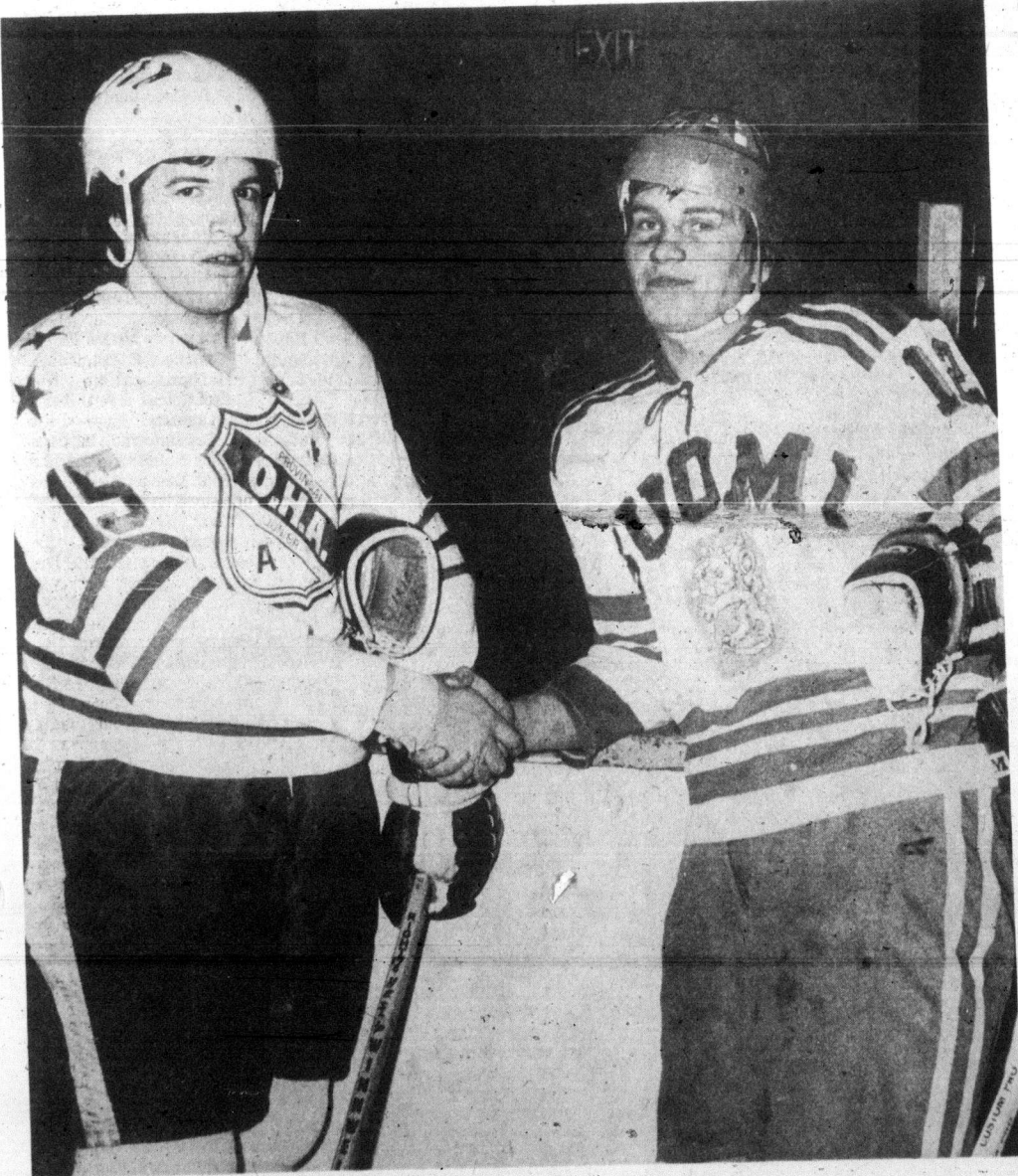

SUMMARY OF THE BY-LAW 1972-5

PURPOSE OF THE BY-LAW The purpose of this by-law is to introduce revised regulations concerning the distance between swimming pools and side lot lines.

EFFECT OF THE BY-LAW Section 22 (2) of the Zoning By-law is amended to reduce from fifty feet (50') to twenty-five feet (25') the distance required between a private swimming pool in a side yard and the side lot lines, except on a corner lot where the pool may be within twelve feet (12') of the flanking road, and within five feet (5') of the other (interior) side lot line if it is a certain distance from the road.

LOCATION OF LAND AFFECTED All residential lands in the Town of Oakville.
