A by-law to amend By-law 1965-136 (Swimming Pools). THE COUNCIL ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. By-law 1965-136 is amended by deleting section 22. (2) and substituting therefor the following:

(2) If in a side yard shall not be less than 25 feet from the side lot line except in the case of a corner lot where it may be within 12 feet of the flanking road or may be within 5 feet of the interior side lot line if no part of the pool is closer to the front lot line than the required front yard for the zone, plus 35 feet.'

2. This by-law takes effect only upon its approval by the Ontario Municipal Board. PASSED by the Council this 4th day of January, 1972

PURPOSE OF THE BY-LAW

The purpose of this by-law is to introduce revised regulations concerning the distance between swimming pools and side lot lines. EFFECT OF THE BY-LAW

Section 22 (2) of the Zoning By-law is amended to reduce from fifty feet (50') to twenty-five feet (25') the distance required between a private swimming pool in a side yard and the side lot lines, except on a corner lot where the pool may be within twelve feet (12') of the flanking road, and within five feet (5') of the other (the interior) side lot line if it is a certain distance from the
