Dear Mr. Apps:

Pursuant to our conversation this morning I enclose copies of Bills Nos. 30, 40, 46, 48, 50, 54 and 64 passed by the House of Commons in 1924, and Bills Nos. 69 and 169 passed by the House of Commons in 1925. Bill 64 and Bill 169 cover the same ground. Bill 48 and Bill 69 also cover the same ground. These Bills were all rejected by the Senate.

There was another Bill relating to a branch line in Nova Scotia passed by the House of Commons and rejected by the Senate at both sessions, but this does not concern us. Will you please have someone look over the enclosed Bills and inform me as to whether the C.P.R. has built or extended any branches into territory which would have been served had the branch lines covered by these bills or any of them been built.
