UNWORTHY OF A PREMIER

IN the censored report of the Conservative Convention printed in the Government organ, Premier Rhodes is credited with the following:

Mr. Rhodes stated, and stated deliberately, in describing ex-Premier King, that he was the most notorious "shifter" and "wriggler" and "squirmer" who had ever held high public office in Canada.

The Herald explains that "though his remarks were brief, it is doubtful if the Premier was very (ever) heard to better advantage."
