
Ottawa, 7th June, 1905.

Sir :-

The Department is in receipt of a letter of 19th May from Dr. Edwards in which he says that you require that "the medicines prescribed in each case shall be written out". It seems to me that Dr. Edwards has probably misunderstood the fourth clause of your requirements as contained in the letter of the 4th of April; it can hardly be possible that you would require copies of the prescriptions given in each case and the Department could not approve of such a requirement. The fourth clause is not so understood here, and I should be glad if you would explain the matter with tact to Dr. Edwards and inform the Department if the requirements of clause 4 have been misunderstood.

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 24th ult., No. 14, the contents of which have been noted.
