Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 7th instant enclosing a communication from the Principal of the G'Appelle Industrial School relative to the action taken by you to place the two children of Sandy Cloud, No. 204, Waywayseecappo's Band, in that school.

In reply I beg to say that the action taken to have these children placed in school, the advancing of the necessary expenses and transportation to the father for this purpose as well as his failing to carry out his promise, is noted. If this man still refuses to have his children sent to the G'Appelle school you should take the necessary steps, under the regulations, to have them admitted to that school and arrange to have a competent person accompany them on the journey.

It is noted that the principal in his letter to you, states that he is anxious to have these children and there does not appear to be any reason for the father refusing to carry out his promise to take them.

You should give this matter your prompt attention and inform the Department of the result of the action taken by you. The necessary applications and certificates of health should be forwarded and if the father refuses to sign the applications you may do so.
