

Seeing Victoria in these comfortable cars is a very pleasant and instructive tour—of about two hours—as the driver or conductor gives details of the points and places of interest that are passed. You are taken through China Town, and then to the best residential quarters, which comprise Linden and Rockland Avenues, Joan Crescent, and Pemberton Road, which is described as “a little bit of old England.” The houses here are on high ground and all of a picturesque style, with beautiful well-kept gardens, stocked with climbing and other roses and bright hued flowers. Government House is a very fine residence with beautiful gardens, in a commanding position in Rockland Avenue. Then out to Oak Bay, and across its 18-hole golf-course back through Beacon Hill Park, passing Gonzales Heights and the “old” Observatory, the Rifle Range, Shoal Bay, Foul Bay and Ross Bay and its cemetery.
