

30 YEARS' EXPERIENCE.

During the thirty years ending on December 31st, 1895, the mortality experience of the Temperance and General Provident Institution of Great Britain was as follows: In the Temperance Section its expected losses were 6,542 for £1,491,557, while its actual losses were 4,626 for £1,002,523, a saving of 1,916 lives and £489,034. In its General Class it expected 9,235 losses for £2,037,946, and its losses were 8,987 for £1,986,217, a saving of 248 for £51,729.

The savings in its Temperance Section were about 30 per cent., and in the General Section about 2 per cent. from the expectations.
