Frank Carvell was born too late to be a Father of Confederation but he has been a sort of a big brother to it ever since he reached years of discretion, seeing that it behaves right and occasionally spraying it for a disease called graft. Canada lost a great propagandist when Frank Carvell became a lawyer and settled down to thriving practice in a prosperous New Brunswick town. But life was not as complicated thirty-five years ago as it is today-the burning wrongs developed later-and the main thing was to earn a living. So Frank Carvel became a lawyer, and, since he was in the business. he made it his concern to be such a good lawyer that everybody wanted him on their side. At least I have never met anybody
