TURE.

Act Passed at the Recent Session.

To amend the Act 45 Victoria, Chapter

34 Intituled 'An Act in aid of the

construction of Railway and other Works

in this province.

In amendment of the Act incorporating

Cemetery Company.

To amend the law respecting the ap-  
pointment of Queen's Counsel.

To provide for the appointment of pro-  
vincial Constables.

Relating to the Assessment for Water

Supply in the City of Saint John.

To authorize an assessment in the city of

Saint John to meet the expenses in-  
curred by the Corporation for the cele-  
bration of the sixtieth year of the reign of

Her Majesty the Queen.

To amend Chapter 46 of the Consoli-  
dated Statutes, 'Witnesses and Evidence.'

To authorize the Municipality of Kings to

grant exemption from taxation

a period of ten years, of the Building,

Works, Plant and Property of 'The

Oakeside Stamping Company,' at Has-  
pington.

To amend Chapter 95 of the Consoli-  
dated Statutes, of 'Lien of Watchmakers

and Jewellers.'

To amend an Act entitled 'An Act to

incorporate the Exhibition Association of

the city and County of Saint John.'

To amend the Act 46 Victoria, Chapter

46, entitled 'An Act relating to the

election of Church wardens and Vestry-

men of Trinity Church in the Parish of

Saint John, in the City of Saint John.

Relating to Saint Joseph's College, and

to change the name thereof to 'The Uni-

versity of Saint Joseph's College.'

To authorize the Municipality of North-

umberland to effect Temporary Loans.

To amend an act to incorporate The

New Brunswick Masonic Hall Company.

To authorize the St. John Bridge and

Railway Extension Company to issue

Debentures for the purpose of paying off

its maturing loans.

To enable the trustees of the First

Moncton Baptist Church, in the City of

Moncton, to issue Debentures on the

security of their corporate property in the

City of Moncton to pay outstanding De-

bentures and other indebtedness.
